

ARTICULATION AGREEMENT

Sending Institution: Faulkner State Community College

Receiving Institution: University of South Alabama

Programs: Associate in Applied Science Degree:
Animation, Interactive Technology, Video Graphics & Visual Effects

This Articulation Agreement between Faulkner State Community College (Faulkner) and the University of South Alabama (USA) and any amendments and supplements are intended to facilitate credit transfer and a smooth transition for graduates of Faulkner into the Bachelor of Science (BS) or Bachelor of Arts (BA) in Interdisciplinary Studies. The two institutions mutually agree on the following:

1. This agreement applies only to students who have met the graduation requirements of Faulkner, and have met all admission requirements to USA.
2. The Bachelor's degree herein referenced and administered by USA's Department of Interdisciplinary Studies requires a minimum of 120 credit hours, of which a maximum of 60 hours can be accepted in transfer from Faulkner.
3. Courses will transfer as described in the Program Articulation Table attached.
4. The signing institutions shall work with students to resolve the transfer of courses should changes to either program occur while the agreement is in effect.
5. Additional requirements and regulations for all degrees appear in the current catalogs for both institutions.
6. This Articulation Agreement is effective on the date signed and shall remain in effect for five years from the date of signing, unless terminated or amended by either party with 90 days prior written notice.



**MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING
BETWEEN
THE UNIVERSITY OF SOUTH ALABAMA,
DEPARTMENT OF EMS EDUCATION
AND
FAULKNER STATE COMMUNITY COLLEGE
DEPARTMENT OF EMS EDUCATION**

The University of South Alabama, by and through its Department of EMS Education (hereinafter referred to as "USAEMS") and Faulkner State Community College (hereinafter referred to as "FSCCEMS") are desirous of promoting academic cooperation, strengthening educational ties between the two institutions, and supporting advanced education for graduates of FSCCEMS Paramedic graduates. The USAEMS will provide a program of study for qualifying graduating Paramedic students from FSCCEMS to work toward obtaining a Bachelor's Degree in EMS.

WHEREAS the paramedic core curriculum (hereinafter referred to as "Core") at the University of South Alabama consists of 40 semester hours as shown in the Academic Bulletin of the University, and

WHEREAS students who have already completed their paramedic training at FSCCEMS can satisfy the USAEMS paramedic Core by ensuring that prior to entry into the EMS baccalaureate degree program they:

- Provide evidence of successful completion of a nationally accredited or state approved (Alabama) paramedic program; and
- Provide evidence of a current state paramedic license or national certification; and
- Request that an official transcript indicating the successful completion of at least 32 semester hours be sent to USA.
- Understand that any transfer credit must be reviewed and approved by the University of South Alabama and the Department of EMS Education prior to admission to the professional component.

BE IT THEREFORE AGREED THAT:


- The USAEMS program will accept qualifying students with Paramedic degrees from FSCCEMS in its Bachelor of Science track.
- Students admitted in the USAEMS program must take a six (6) credit hour bridge course under the EMS Core after admission to the professional component.
- All students accepted in the USAEMS program must complete the EMS Core courses required in the curriculum in order to qualify for the BS degree in EMS.


- USAEMS and FSCCEMS will establish and specify appropriate communication between their respective colleges, academic and administrative units and student groups to accomplish the completion of the BS degree in EMS.
- This Memorandum of Understanding will be applicable for a period of five years beginning with the academic year of 2013-14. It shall be automatically renewed for an additional five years unless either party expresses the desire to terminate the agreement.
- Separate addenda to this Memorandum of Understanding will specify the objectives, manner of execution, and administrative responsibility of each institution.


Any matter not clarified in this Memorandum of Understanding will be resolved by mutual agreement of the participating institutions.
